

A BROOKLYN JEWELER DETECTIVE.

He Meets a Missing Clerk Face to Face in New York.

Three weeks ago Julius Miller, 21 years old, of 201 Madison street, New York, entered the employ of Max J. Annenberg, jeweler, 456 Grand street, this city. On Monday last Miller failed to report for duty. The jeweler suspected something wrong, and upon examining his stock discovered that \$300 worth of property was missing. He then started out to find his clerk. He met him face to face in Norfolk street, near Grand, yesterday afternoon. When Miller saw his employer he staggered as if shot, but recovering himself quickly he fled toward Grand street. Annenberg was close behind him shouting for the police. Officer Flay of the Eleventh precinct took up the chase and caught Miller just as he was about to board a Grand street car.

Miller was searched. Over \$100 worth of jewelry and \$40 in money was found in his pockets. Mr. Annenberg identified the jewelry as his property. Captain Cross held Miller to await the arrival of a Brooklyn officer who has a warrant for his arrest on a charge of grand larceny.
