
Knauer/Walzer Family - 1815 to Present



Gershon (George) Walzer was the first member of the family to came to the U.S. in 1895 at age 16 Moses Chaim Knauer and his nephew, Max (Mordshe) Knauer, came to the U.S. together in 1900 on the Palatia Beile Walzer came to the U.S. in 1900 on the same ship as Moses and Max to join her brother Hersh (Gershon) Pauline (Paye) Walzer came to the U.S. in 1900 on the same ship as Moses and Max and married Gershon in 1904 Schlima Knauer (nee Augenstein) came to the U.S. with David, Rose and Joseph in 1901 to join husband, Moses David Knauer came to the U.S. in 1905 (passage paid by brother, Max, residing at 26 Norfolk St., NYC) Jacob Walzer came to the U.S. in 1907 (passage paid by brother, Gershon, residing at 26 Norfolk St., NYC) Rebecca (Rose) Walzer came to the U.S. in 1911 at age 17 to join her father Jacob, residing at E. 9th St., NYC Ida (Chaijke) Waltzer came to the U.S. in 1912 to join brother David residing at 511 Hopkinson Ave., Brooklyn Sure (Sarah) Walzer came to the U.S. in 1912 with Mindie, Joseph, Dora, Perl and Beile to join husband, Jacob

^{*} Henie Knauer married Berel Walzer in 1866 or 1867 after her husband, Mordko Wolf, died and Berel Walzer's wife, Riwka, died; Henie Knauer was the daughter of Dawid Knauer and Miszka Knauer (nee Stenfeld) of Uscie Biskupie; Henie's sister, Feige (married to Chaim Chanina Leistner) was the mother of Max's wife, Myszka Lassner

^{**} Rebecca Walzer (also known as Rose) married Samuel Max (Sapsy) Walzer, son of Joseph Walzer (brother of Berel Walzer)
